NIT Srinagar all set to implement official language

NIT Srinagar to ensure maximum use of Hindi on campus

Srinagar, Mar 16: Following directions of the Union Ministry of Education, the National Institute of Technology, Srinagar (NIT) is gearing up to implement the Hindi language in official work of the premier institute.

To oversee the implementation of the official language (Rajbasha), Director Official Language Department, Union Ministry of Higher Education, Sunita Sharma held an interaction on Tuesday with Director NIT, Srinagar, Prof. Dr. Rakesh Seghal and Registrar Prof. S K Bukhari here.

A statement said the Director OL was apprised about the progress in implementation of the official language on the campus. A separate Hindi Cell has been created for the implementation of Rajbasha at the institute.

Director OL also visited various sections of the NIT Srinagar and interacted with Heads of Departments (HOD), faculty members including in-charge of Hindi Cell to



take an account of work being done for the official language implementation.

Sunita Sharma said the main objective of the official language is to conduct the official transaction in one language throughout the country.

As per provisions of section 3 (3) of the Official Language Act 1963, the website of the institute should be bilingual (Hindi and English). Signboards, stationery items, forms, notice boards, rubber stamps, etc be prepared in the regional language, Hindi, and

English as well.

In order to learn and acquaint the staff with the official language, the Union HRD Ministry has directed NIT Srinagar to use computer-based 'Learn Indian Languages through Artificial intelligence' (LILA) software's main components — Prabodh, Praveen and Pragya — for officials nominated for working in Hindi.

The LILA is a multi-media-based intelligent self-tutoring application for learning Hindi and other regional languages.

On the occasion, Director NIT, Srinagar Rakesh Seghal said the institute is duty-bound to fulfil the national mandate for the implementation of Rajbasha.

Dr. Sehgal stressed on ensuring maximum use of the official language on the campus. He stated that faculty and other staff members have evinced a keen interest in learning the Hindi language.

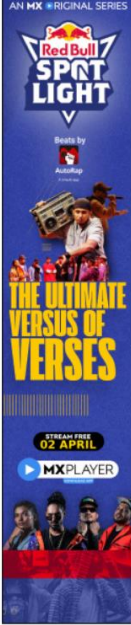
on the NIT campus recently.

"As compared to the rest of the states and UTs, there has been a marginal increase in J&K. If precautions are not taken, we fear the numbers will increase considerably. The herd immunity can be one of the reasons for less patient load. But we never know how long it will last. It is possible that herd immunity cannot protect us of the mutant strains enter the valley," Dr Naved said.
Nodal Officer Government Medical College, Srinagar, Dr Salim Khan said the hospital admissions of Covid cases have gone up during the last three weeks.

Two more lives lost, 97 new cases

Srinagar, Mar 16: Covid-19 on Tuesday claimed two more lives in Jammu and Kashmir taking the toll of deaths related to Covid-19 to 1,976 while 97 fresh positive cases were reported taking the tally of positive cases to 127,831. Of the exact number of 127,831 cases, 75,584 are from Kashmir and 52,247 from the Jammu division.
Officials said that among 97 new cases, 78 belong to the Kashmir division while 19 are from the Jammu division, adding

ing that the total number of positive cases in the Kashmir division has reached 75,584 including 73,591 recoveries and 1,245 deaths while as a total number of positive cases in Jammu division has reached to 52,247 including 51,291 recoveries and 731 deaths.
The officials said that the total number of active cases in Jammu and Kashmir are 973 including 748 from the Kashmir division and 225 from the Jammu division.

Tuesday sanctioned the constitution of Committee to frame guidelines for allotment of commercial assets of various Municipal Corporations/Councils/Committees, Development Authorities and Housing Board under the administrative control of Housing and Urban Development Department.
The committee will include Commissioner JMC as Convener while as Commissioner SMC, Vice Chairman, JDA / SDA, Director Urban Local Bodies Jammu/Kashmir, Vice Chairman LANWA and Managing Director Housing Board will be its members.
The committee shall study best practices for allotment of commercial municipal properties in progressive States/UTs of the country and frame guidelines for allotment of commercial assets in the UT of J&K, the order stated.
The Committee shall give its recommendations within three weeks from the date of issue of notification, the order reads.

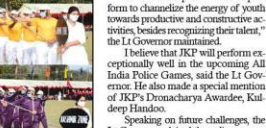

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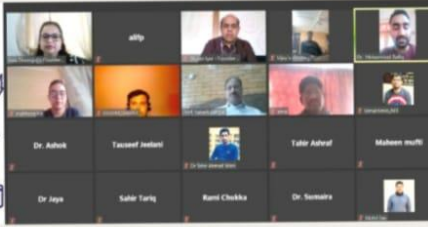
He said such events are important in every professional institute, especially for the academicians and students of NIT Srinagar.
