We have received mails from students of 2019 batch to reconsider the decision of the administration circulated on web site vide No NIT/DAA/2021/96 Dated feb-27-2021. In this regard, it is to inform all the stake holders that we have also received phone calls and mails from students, their parents appreciating our decision in the wake of second wave of Covid-19, as well.

Moreover, recently Neuberg Diagnostics, an Indian laboratory Company, held a panel discussion on "Coronavirus – variants and vaccination" to seek an expert opinion on the subsequent waves of the pandemic. The experts who participated in the panel were of the opinion that there will be a second wave of coronavirus in the country, more severe and deadly than the previous one.

Dr. V. Ravi, former Professor of Neurovirology at NIMHAN and Nodal Officer for Genomic confirmation of SARS-CoV-2 Government of Karnataka said, "If you are not infected or not vaccinated, then be sure that the virus will catch you. Sooner or later, the virus will catch most of us." He explained that when there is an unprecedented surge of infection, people are supposed to behave responsibly.

Now we are observing that Kerala, Maharashtra, Punjab, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat and Madhya Pradesh showing spike in daily coronavirus cases, triggering worries for the government and us as well. The states of Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu has already extended the lockdown in some areas till March 31, 2021, which is likely to be extend in other areas of the country while observing the following details:
